Members of **Local History Group 7** enjoyed a recent guided tour along the front of Waterloo. The tour started with a coffee in the Bistro "Waterloo Place" at the bottom of South Road, overlooking the Marina. It was here that we met our guide, James Gentles.

The tour started at the Royal Hotel and lasted about 1 and half hours. We walked along Marine Crescent, Adelaide Terrace and Beach Lawn, during which time our James talked about the history of Waterloo and some of the prominent people who lived in the houses bordering these roads overlooking the river. He noted the different types of architecture of the houses on the roads and the time frame over which they were built. The tour concluded with a walk through the gardens bordering the river and a brief history of their origin. Our James requested that the tour fee was donated to the "Friends of Waterloo Seafront Gardens" to help restore and promote

the local sea front gardens and Potter's Barn Park; James is a member of this group.

We were very lucky with the weather in that it was very warm and sunny, which added to a very enjoyable morning. The visit

concluded with a meal in Wetherspoons, "The Picture House" in South Road, Waterloo, where we had an area reserved for the meal.

Late afternoon we departed for Blackpool and the White Tower Restaurant. Here, at 5:15pm, we were served the most delicious and piping hot Fish and Chip meal with bread and butter, followed by Apple Pie and Cream, then coffee or tea. All this was included in the price of our ticket.



We then had a short walk to the purpose built Ice Arena and eagerly awaited 'The Hot Ice Show 2016'. This for me was the highlight of the trip. It was a fabulous, spectacular, high energy show.

It starred a cast of world championship ice skaters. The performers wore Las Vegas 'showgirl' style costumes with fur, feathers and lots of sparkle. Graceful solos and high octane group routines followed in rapid succession and the impressive and amusing 'bath' routine was amazing. Fireworks and flying routines, with stunning special effects enhanced each performance. It certainly had the 'wow' factor!



Finally, as an extra surprise, Ann had arranged with the coach driver to drive us through Blackpool Illuminations, travelling North from the funfair, and culminating with the fabulous tableaux. It took just one hour to do this and we then headed home. All the Cinderellas and Prince Charmings on board the coach were home for midnight!

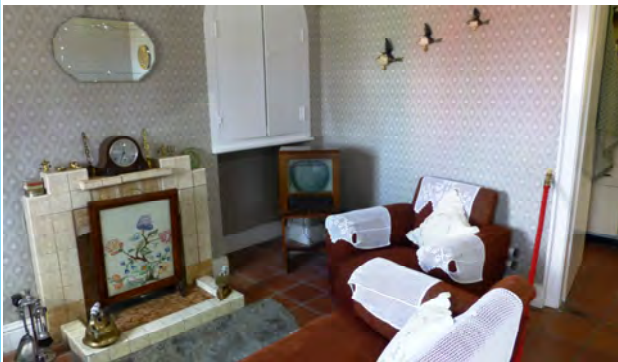


National Waterways Museum



Local History Group 4 recently visited the Ellesmere Port Boat Museum. The museum is situated at the northern end of the Shropshire Union Canal where it meets the Manchester Ship Canal. Our visit started with tea, coffee and biscuits in the Waterside Café after which we were split into two groups for the tour. We started in the blacksmith's forge where all the ironwork used by the canal workers was made. Next was the Power Hall and the Pump House full of various steam engines.

Walking around the canal docks we were shown many historic boats and barges used on the rivers and canals. There was even a barge made entirely of concrete and an ice breaker barge.



The tour ended up at the Porters Row Cottages. These four cottages showed domestic life in the 1830s, 1900s, 1930s and the 1950s. It proved amusing when members of our party recognised various items displayed in the cottages from their own childhood (all before my time of course!).
