## Bootle Town Hall

"Come into my parlour" said the Mayor of Sefton to **Local History Group 9** when we visited Bootle Town Hall and aren't we glad we did. Not only were we treated to a tour of the Parlour but also the Mayoress's room and the Council Chamber by the great man himself, Iain Brodie-Browne, who is the current Mayor of Sefton. Sadly we didn't get to see the ballroom which was the venue of many a good night out in the 50s and

60s.



The Town Hall was built very near the boundary of Bootle and Liverpool as a statement to show Bootle was separate from Liverpool and of Bootle's importance and local standing. It was designed by John Johnson ARIBA and opened in April 1882 and many a Mayor and Mayoress have hosted grand events in this fine Renaissance style building since that date. There are many "treasures" on display in these rooms including decorative and commemorative silver ware, ceremonial maces, and also one civic oar (one of only eight in the country). There were plaques and a beautiful Crown Derby china dinner service, all donated by the great and the good of Bootle, when Bootle was a thriving town and port and cargo brought into the nearby docks spelt wealth and prosperity for the town. A most impressive item was a silver clock, the largest piece of civic silver which represented the tower of the Town Hall. It had been presented to Sir Ernest Royden, when MP of Bootle in 1922. After his death it was said that the Lady Royden presented the clock to the Bootle Council for inclusion in their civic silverware collection.

The Council Chamber has a definite "wow" factor with its many flags and plaques displayed celebrating Bootle's close association with its maritime history and the magnificent stained glass windows representing the coats of arms of whole of the



North West area survived the Blitz. The Chamber itself is not set out in a semi-circle but based on Westminster parliament with benches on either side, separated by the distance of two sword lengths.

After having our



photograph taken in the council chamber with the Mayor, Iain Brodie-Browne, we joined him and his staff for tea and coffee and thanked them for a very interesting and enjoyable tour.
